Message from the PCDBA PCDWBA Tournament Director:

Tournament Update – Concord in Just 2 Weeks!

We're just two weeks away from our exciting tournament in Concord, CA, and we're ready to make it a fun and competitive event for everyone!

Here's a quick breakdown of the participation numbers:

- **Men's Teams:** 14 teams
- **Women's Teams:** 10 teams
- **Queens:** 9 bowlers
- **Senior Queens:** 11 bowlers
- **Masters:** 28 bowlers
- **Senior Masters:** 14 bowlers

Important Notes for Walk-Ins:

- **Senior Masters and Senior Queens:** Walk-in participants **must pay before bowling Singles and Doubles on Friday.**
- **Queens and Masters:** Walk-ins are allowed - **up until Saturday at noon. (after the team event)**

There are new rules in place beginning with this year's Senior Masters and Senior Queens events:

- There will be **no** qualifying round this year for the Senior Women.
- Rankings will be based on **ACTUAL** Singles, Doubles and Team scores, without handicap.
- The top 8 bowlers will advance to Sunday's finals, where they will bowl **one** game matches in a double elimination format.

For the Men's Masters, we currently have 28 bowlers registered. The cut off will be the top 16 bowlers who will advance to bowl on Sunday. We have 9 Queens entries and the top 8 bowlers will advance to Sunday's finals.

For the Senior Masters, we currently have 14 bowlers registered. If two more bowlers walk in before Singles and Doubles events begin, we will increase the field to 16 bowlers and adjust the cut accordingly. Otherwise the top 8 bowlers will advance to Sunday's finals.
