Historical & Cultural Highlights

Don Francisco Galindo House & Gardens

A beautifully preserved Victorian-era ranch house built in 1856. Now a museum operated by the Concord Historical Society, it offers tours and captivating gardens.

Don Salvio Pacheco Adobe

The oldest known building in Diablo Valley, constructed in 1835 by ranchero Salvio Pacheco. Significantly tied to Concord's early history.

Don Fernando Pacheco Adobe

Built in the early 1850s by Salvio's son, this adobe is listed on the National, State, and local historic registers.

Outdoors & Scenic Escapes

Mount Diablo State Park

Offers panoramic views of the Bay Area, with great trails for hikers and cyclists.

• Lime Ridge Open Space, Iron Horse Trail, & Contra Costa Canal Trail Ideal for hiking or biking, offering picturesque trails through local landscapes.

• Markham Nature Park & Arboretum

A peaceful 16-acre arboretum featuring native plants, a historic farmhouse, and educational programs.

• Toyota Pavilion at Concord (formerly Concord Pavilion)

An outdoor amphitheater seating up to 12,500, hosting concerts, community events, and the annual jazz festival.

• Six Flags Hurricane Harbor Concord

A popular waterpark packed with slides, wave pools, and other thrills—great for cooling off on warm days.

• Pixieland Amusement Park

A kid-friendly amusement park offering rides and fun for the younger crowd.

• Todos Santos Plaza

A vibrant, central plaza featuring green space, regular farmers markets, live music events, eateries, and seasonal festivals.
